- St. Ignatius High School

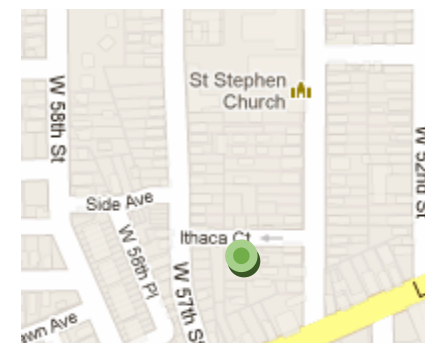
Fresh, Local Food

The **EcoVillage** was founded through a grassroots movement to create a more healthy and attractive urban environment in 1998.

The EcoVillage is centered around the W.65th-Lorain Avenue Rapid Station that was renovated to meet Cleveland's green building standards in 2004.

The EcoVillage highlights *green buildings* through energy-efficient and LEED-certified housing, *societal independence* through the Zone Recreation Center and Block clubs, *transit-oriented development* with the Rapid Station and pedestrian-friendly streets, and *urban agriculture* with community gardens and a local Farmers' Market.
